It will be co-hosted by our network member – Romanian Academy – Institute of Agricultural Economics together with Romanian Association of Rural and Agri-Food Economy "Virgil Madgearu", Research Institute for Agriculture Economy and Rural Development – Academy of Agricultural and Forestry Sciences, and will take place on 23-25 September in Bucharest!
